Wyneken Illness Policy: From the Parent/Teacher Handbook, page 17: The school should be notified immediately of a communicable disease. All children are to be excluded from school for a communicable disease or a condition that is readily transmitted to others. A written permit from the doctor is required when a child returns to school after recovering from any communicable disease. If a child has an acute upper respiratory infection, sore throat, earache, upset stomach, or an elevated temperature of 100 degrees or more, the student should be kept home or will be sent home. Children should remain home for A FULL 24 HOURS following an episode of fever or vomiting to ensure full recovery.

Dress Code Reminder: From the Parent/Teacher Handbook, page 11:

Hats are not to be worn in the school building. Parents are asked to monitor T-shirt slogans that show disrespect to any groups or individuals. Wyneken requires all children, during their time outside, to wear coats, hats, etc., with which they arrived in the morning. Only in case of sudden change in the weather will there be any exceptions. Parents who do not wish to comply with this regulation must notify the teachers personally or in writing.

It is recommended to place identifying marks on all items of clothing that the children may remove in school. The proper attire for school is left to the discretion of the school administration. It should be kept in mind, however, the school is a public place and neatness and decency must always be observed. Any dress or style, including body piercing, tattoos, etc., that does not fit with a Christian atmosphere or openly disrupts or cause distraction will not be allowed. This will help create an environment that is both spiritually healthy and good for proper learning. There are certain items that are not allowed. These include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Unusual hairstyles or hair colors
- 2) Attitude shirts.
- 3) Any item that reflects anti-Christian, satanic, or death messages.
- 4) Tight fitting pants, shorts, leggings and capris may only be worn if covered by a skirt, shorts or longer top of fingertip length.
- 5) Any clothing that is sloppy in appearance or torn.
- 6) Any clothing that inappropriately exposes one's self.
- 7) Any clothing with writing across the buttocks.
- 8) Every student will need a separate pair of gym/athletic shoes to be worn in the new gym for PE classes/recesses. These shoes will be kept at school at ALL times.
- 9) Students participating in activities at recess time must wear appropriate shoes for physical activity. Students not wearing appropriate shoes, such as flip-flops or open backed shoes, will not be allowed to participate in physical activity.

Shorts and capris may be worn to school from the start of school in August to October 15th; and from April 1st to the end of the school year. The guidelines for the wearing of shorts are as follows:

- A. Shorts, dresses and skirts must be at least fingertip length when a student is standing with his/her arms down by his/her side. Shirts and blouses must be long enough to cover the abdomen *at all times*.
- B. Shorts and capris must be hemmed with no frayed edges.
- C. No tight fitting shorts or capris are permitted. SEE #4 above

If a student dresses inappropriately, he/she will be required to make a change of clothing. The student will be allowed to call home for a change of clothing or a change of clothing will be provided for the student. The student will not be allowed in the classroom until they are wearing acceptable clothing.
